Roosevelt Presidential Library and Museum and the Roosevelt-Vanderbilt National Historic Sites will host a series of free holiday events for families. The Roosevelt Library and the Home of FDR (Springwood) will be decorated for the holidays during the month of December and open to visitors free of charge on December 5 from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. There will be refreshments and special activities beginning at Noon in the Henry A. Wallace Visitor and Education Center. Parking at the sites is limited and attendees are asked to plan their visits accordingly.

### **Holiday Open House - December 5, 2009 - Roosevelt Library and Home, Val-Kill**

Holiday Open House on December 5 is from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. both at the Home of FDR National Historic Site -- where there will be readings from Dickens's *A Christmas Carol* -- and at the Roosevelt Library with a chance to see the special exhibition, "*Action and Action Now*" *FDR's First 100 Days*. Both the Library and Home will be decorated for the holidays as they were during the Roosevelt presidency. Admission is free to the Home and Library throughout the day.

Eleanor Roosevelt National Historic Site (Val-Kill) will also be free and open to visitors from 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. on the December 5. Visitors to Val-Kill are required to take a shuttle from Henry A. Wallace Center at the FDR Presidential Library and Home. **There will be no onsite parking at Val-Kill on December 5 from 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.** Refreshments and music will be provided by the Roosevelt-Vanderbilt Historical Association.

### **Holiday Open House - December 12, 2009 - Vanderbilt Mansion**

Holiday Open House at the Vanderbilt Mansion is Saturday, December 12 from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Admission to the Vanderbilt Mansion on December 12 will be free of charge. The Mansion will be decorated for the holidays and visitors will enjoy live music and refreshments provided by the Roosevelt-Vanderbilt Historical Association.
