HOLIDAY EVENTS Children's Reading Festival, Live Music, Crafts, Santa and Holiday Open Houses

On Saturday, December 13, 2008, the Franklin D. Roosevelt Presidential Library and Museum and the Home of Franklin D. Roosevelt National Historic Site in historic Hyde Park, New York, will host a series of free events for families.

The day kicks off with the third annual Children's Reading Festival, from 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m., presented by the Roosevelt Library and Teaching the Hudson Valley.

Donald Estes uses his experiences as a real life fire chief (East Clinton Fire Department) to inform his books, *Willy: the Little Jeep Who Wanted to be a Fire Truck*, and *Willy and Friends*. Along with the author, the 'star' of Estes' books, Willy the Jeep, will be making a personal appearance at the festival.

Caldecott Award-winning author and illustrator, **Peter McCarty** has created memorable works for children including *Hondo and Fabian*, *Fabian Escapes*, *Little Bunny on the Move* and *Moon Plane*. He will read and talk about his work. An appearance by FDR's dog, Fala, will round out the reading portion of the day's events.

Books will be available for purchase and signing. Admission is free.

In addition, there will be free photos with Santa, a crafts table where children can make holiday cards for the sailors on the USS Franklin and Eleanor Roosevelt, refreshments, a free tasting of Hudson Valley Fresh milk and spirited performances by young local musicians.

The day is completed by Holiday Open Houses from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. at the festively decorated Home of FDR, where there will be a reading from *A Christmas Carol*, and at the FDR Presidential Library and Museum with a chance to see the special exhibition, *Freedom From Fear: FDR Commander in Chief.* Open House programs are free of charge.
