Sharing with the cadets and pilots in this hearty effort are the members of the trained ground crews, those air mechanics, skilled instrument technicians, radio operators, weather men, medical specialists and other technicians who are trained for their duties.

Back as long ago as February 1941, some 500 men started training at Chanute Field for jobs they were to fill at the new Tuskegee Army Flying School in Alabama. They came to T.A.F.S. in November, 1941.

It must always be remembered that for each pilot who takes to the air there are on the ground scores of enlisted men who actually aid in maintaining a pilot on a flight, and who are sometimes unsung but always and forever essential to the Army Air Forces.
