HYDE PARK, NY -- On Wednesday, June 11, 2014 the Roosevelt Library and the Home of FDR National Historic Site will host a Hot Dog Picnic and special programs in commemoration of the 75th anniversary of the 1939 British Royal Visit to Hyde Park, New York on June 11, 1939. During that historic visit, President and Mrs. Roosevelt famously served hot dogs to King George VI and Queen Elizabeth as part of a picnic celebration at FDR's private retreat, Top Cottage. Programs for families, picnic fare and free tours of Top Cottage (registered visitors to be shuttled from the Wallace Center) will be available throughout the afternoon and early evening.
