**Franklin D. Roosevelt Presidential Library and Museum
to Host National Issues Forum on Economic Security
November 18, 2010 at 7:00 p.m.**

HYDE PARK, NY -- In collaboration with the National Issues Forums Institute (NIFI) and the Kettering Foundation, the Franklin D. Roosevelt Presidential Library and Museum will host a public discussion on economic security on November 18 at 7:00 p.m. The program will take place in the Henry A. Wallace Center at the FDR Presidential Library and Home. Refreshments will be served. Following the program forum attendees will receive free admission to the Roosevelt Library's new exhibition "**OUR PLAIN DUTY**": **FDR and AMERICA'S SOCIAL SECURITY**. This forum is free and open to the public but **pre-registration is required** as space is limited. Please call (845) 486-7745 to register.

In communities all across the country, Presidential Libraries of the National Archives and Records Administration are participating in National Issues Forums. **The Roosevelt Library will hold the November 18, 2010 public forum and two student forums in Spring 2011.** The forums are intended to reflect the interests and enthusiasm of the community that supports the Libraries. As a result, the forums will be held in a variety of locations including the Presidential Libraries, local community centers, public libraries and university campuses. Attendees are encouraged to participate in the discussion.

"Hosting National Issues Forums at the Presidential Libraries is consistent with our emphasis on civic education," Sharon Fawcett, Assistant Archivist of the United States for Presidential Libraries, said. "Presidential Libraries are public places and it is appropriate for citizens to engage in intense discussions of major public policy issues in the midst of a presidential campaign. However, the goal should be hosting discussions which are balanced, civil in tone and fair-minded."

“Participants in a forum,” NIFI President William Muse, said, “deliberate with one another -- eye-to-eye, face to-face, exploring options, weighing others’ views, considering the costs and consequences of public policy decisions. In a democracy, citizens have a responsibility to make choices about how to solve problems and forums help enrich participants’ thinking on public issues. By offering citizens a framework for deliberative forums, NIFI helps the public take an active role in acting on public issues.”

The National Issues Forums Institute is a 26-year-old nonpartisan, nationwide network of locally sponsored forums for the consideration of public policy issues. Forums are rooted in the simple notion that citizens need to come together to reason and talk -- to deliberate about common problems.
