HYDE PARK, NY -- On December 8, 2013 the National Park Service will host its annual Holiday Open House at the Vanderbilt Mansion National Historic Site. The Mansion will be decorated for the holidays and afternoon visitors will enjoy complimentary refreshments. Admission will be free of charge. On December 14, 2013, the Franklin D. Roosevelt Presidential Library and Museum and the Home of FDR National Historic Site will host a series of free holiday events. The Roosevelt Library and the Home of FDR (Springwood) will be open to visitors free of charge on December 14 from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. There will be holiday decorations, refreshments and special activities -- including the annual Children's Reading Festival -- beginning at Noon in the Henry A. Wallace Visitor and Education Center. Holiday Open House at Val-Kill will run from 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. on December 14 with a shuttle running from the Wallace Center. Parking at the sites is limited and attendees are encouraged to carpool when possible.

Holiday Open House - December 8, 2013 - Vanderbilt Mansion

On December 8, the Vanderbilt Mansion National Historic Site will be free of charge to visitors from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Holiday Open House will be held from 11:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on December 8. The Mansion will be decorated for the holidays and refreshments will be provided by the Roosevelt-Vanderbilt Historical Association.

Children's Reading Festival, Santa and Holiday Cards for Troops

The eighth annual Children's Reading Festival -- presented by the Roosevelt Library and the Friends of the Poughkeepsie Public Library District -- will be held in the Henry A. Wallace Center, from Noon to 4:00 p.m. on December 14. Children's book authors -- including acclaimed author of the MADELINE books, **John Bemelmans Marciano** (who carries on the legacy of his grandfather, Ludwig Bemelmans) -- will read from and sign copies of their books. Featured books will be available for purchase in the New Deal Store in the Wallace Center.

Holiday Open House - December 14, 2013 - Roosevelt Library and Home, Val-Kill

Holiday Open House on December 14 is from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. both at the Home of FDR National Historic Site -- where there will be readings from Dickens's "A Christmas Carol" -- and at the Roosevelt Library with a chance to see the newly installed permanent museum exhibits. Both the Home and the Roosevelt Library study will be decorated for the holidays as they were during the Roosevelt presidency. Admission is free to the Home and Library throughout the day.

Eleanor Roosevelt National Historic Site (Val-Kill) will also be free and open to visitors from 1:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. on December 14. Beginning at 4:00 p.m., visitors to Val-Kill are required to take a shuttle from Henry A. Wallace Center at the FDR Presidential Library and Home. There will be no onsite parking at Val-Kill on December 14 from 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Refreshments and music will be provided by the Roosevelt-Vanderbilt Historical Association.
